<b>Class 3</b> content	Explore similarities and differences between festivals in the UK and France. Explore different greetings in French and greet each other.	Children will develop basic vocabulary, asking and answering simple questions about where people live. Explore numbers to add to addresses and make postcards.	Begin by discussing family members and key vocabulary. Move on to pets and animals, leading on to the song 'Old McDonald'.	Explore simple instructions, such as stand up, sit down etc. Learn vocabulary for different lessons and discuss favourites.	Explore different vegetables and the life cycle of a plant. Introduce the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. Children will join in with repeated phrases.	Using the idea of a toy shop, introduce vocabulary on different toys. Children can explore how much different toys cost and create posters to advertise them.
<b>Class 4</b> content	Explore further aspects of everyday life in France. Investigate famous people and events. Compare with the UK.	Children will learn to ask and answer questions about their home. They will explore vocabulary on different homes/rooms etc and engage in discussion with others about their homes.	Children will engage in discussion about their friends, explaining what they like about them. Use dictionaries to research new vocabulary.	Explore PE within school, including different activities and exercises. Children will create their own game and share instructions with others about how to play.	Children will explore vocabulary linked to picnics. They will create shopping lists and recipes and e-mail them to friends. Use dictionaries to research new vocabulary.	Explore and learn vocabulary and phrases linked to the beach. Children will create a poster to advertise a particular beach using persuasive language.
